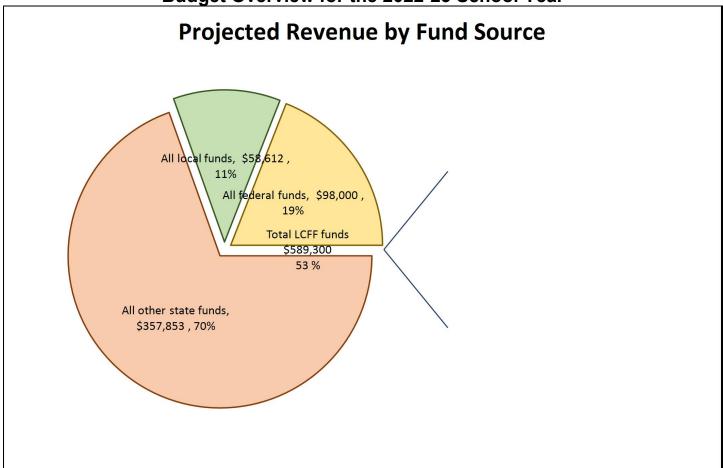

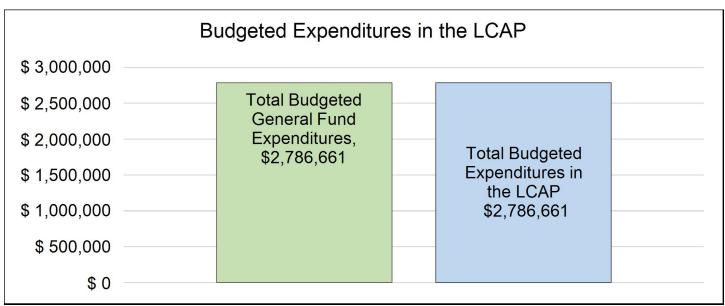
This chart shows the total general purpose revenue New Joseph Bonnheim Community Charter expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The text description for the above chart is as follows: The total revenue projected for New Joseph Bonnheim Community Charter is \$1,103,765, of which \$\$589,300.00 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), \$\$357,853.00 is other state funds, \$\$58,612.00 is local funds, and \$98,000 is federal funds. Of

the \$\$589,300.00 in LCFF Funds, \$1,450, 000.00 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

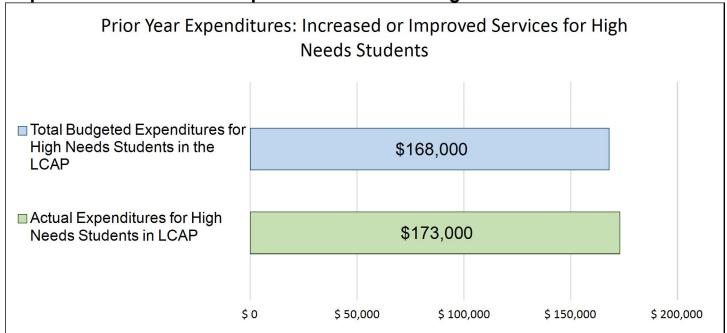
